

It bites primarily early in the morning and at sunset, but also at other times

of the day


**Females** bite and are responsible for disease

transmission

It needs blood to reproduce It's black with white markings

lyre-shaped and banded legs

It sucks blood every three or four days or sometimes more frequently



8 Shortly after a blood meal, females lay their eggs in the inside walls of any container with clean standing water

A female Aedes can lay around 400 eggs during her lifetime

10 Aedes eggs

can **resist** drought and **survive** for up to a year

An egg can develop into a larva, pupa and adult within 7 to 10 days

An adult mosquito can live 4 to 6 weeks
