UNVACCINATED TRAVELLERS
will be subject to quarantine

1-in-2 severely
affected people die
from yellow fever



ONLY APPROVED TRAVEL HEALTH CLINICS
can administer the
yellow fever vaccine

Yellow fever develops
within 6 days
of being bitten by an
infected mosquito



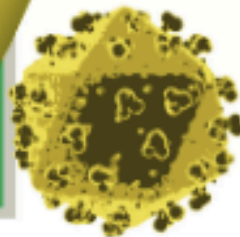
TRAVELLERS IMMUNISED AGAINST YELLOW FEVER
receive an internationally recognised
vaccination certificate for inspection
by immigration officials

Symptoms include:
fever, severe headaches,
back pain, general body
aches, nausea,
vomiting, fatigue



EXEMPTION CERTIFICATES
are available from a travel doctor
for those unable to have the
vaccination for medical reasons

A single dose of yellow
fever vaccine provides
protection against yellow
fever for 10 years
